By signing below, you agree to the following:

- I will take every precaution to ensure the safety of all those in my vehicle.
- In order to be in compliance with the Safe Environment Project for the Diocese of Oakland, I shall ensure that no adult be in a car alone with minors and that a second adult will be present at all times.
- I understand that the law requires seatbelts for each person riding in the car.
- I understand that children under the age of 8 and under $4^{\prime} 9 \prime$ must be secured in an appropriate child passenger restraint (safety seat or booster seat) in the back seat of the vehicle.
- I understand that all children age 12 and under should ride in a rear seat unless children under the age of 12 already occupy all rear seats.
- If my card has air bags, I will follow the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration recommendations that:
- Children age 12 and under should ride in a rear seat.
- If children 12 years and younger must sit in the front seat, first ensure that they use seat belts and/or child restraints appropriate for their size or weight. Then move their vehicle seat all the way back. The child needs to be sitting with his/her back against the seat back, with as little slack as possible in the belt.
