In Loving Memory

To some, the words "family", "love" and "support" are just every day words, that sometimes lose their definitions. However, sometimes God blesses us with someone who can show us and our children the true meanings of these words. Bring these words to life. Shows us the positive effects these words have on those around us. For our community, that was Ed "Chat" Chatterton.

Natives of New York, Ed and his wife, also his best friend, Mary, moved to California and started a family. They had four children, Jeremy, Trevor, Marie and Cameron, all alums of St. Agnes. Jeremy, Chat's oldest son, remembers his father as, "Always being there". "For my dad, it was family first". "If you needed a ride at two in the morning or just someone to talk to, he was there." He also noted how his dad, an interior demolitionist, "... would go to work at three in the morning so he could make our meets. He never wanted to miss anything."

But Chat didn't just want to watch his children run track for St. Agnes, he wanted to be involved. As a strong athlete himself, Chat became an assistant coach for St. Agnes track and eventually took over the program towards the end of the 1980s. He immediately made an ever lasting impact on the program.

Jeremy recalled the important lessons he learned from playing for and while coaching with his father, "My father made the program fun. The drills he ran taught us how to be better, they were challenging, but in a fun way." "Kids wanted to be out there working cause it was fun, as it was competitive," Jeremy remembers, "Whatever event you were doing, you could look over your shoulder and see Coach watching. Cheering you on." Jeremy explained how important it was for Coach Chatterton to build the self-esteem of a child, "...get them ready for life, as well as, make them an athlete. "What ever problems you were having, either at home or on the track, Coach Chatterton was there to listen and give advice.

Coach Chatterton built a competitive and winning track program at St. Agnes, but more importantly, he created a program that taught our kids about integrity, accountability, confidence and humility. Current director of St. Agnes Track, Ann Burris–Schultz, said, "From the uniforms he help get to the winning culture he created, we try to uphold the values he instilled into this program. It's because of his philosophy, beliefs and caring, the program is where it is today, for the school and the children. For this, we will forever be grateful."

Outside of coaching, Ed was an Eucharistic minister. He also counseled those in trouble. "He loved working 'gang bangers', breaking them down and helping them in their journey back", Jeremy remembered. When Mary passed away from cancer, he started the "Mary Chatterton Memorial Track Meet'. To this day, "MC" is worn on the track uniforms. Oh! And let us not forget that he was also the handyman for the Church. This was the type of man "Chat" was.

This year, St. Agnes lost an influential figure of our community. However, his legacy will never be forgotten. We, along with our kids, can carry it on if we just be "Real with our selves" like Chat believed we should be.





2020 has been a tough year and we all could use a some cheer. No better way to accomplish this than taking a drive down Candy Cane Lane!! The Christmas spirit was strong at St. Agnes this year with treats, special gifts, sprirt wear and the Contra Costa Fire Department!! And of course, who was there to spread the cheer, Santa!!
