Principal's Thoughts

This Sunday we will celebrate Palm Sunday, the last Sunday of Lent. This day also marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most reverent time in our liturgical calendar. Parishioners will first gather outside to hear a reading from Luke describing Jesus's entrance into Jerusalem, riding a colt (the foal of a donkey.) Donkeys symbolize service and humility, signaling perhaps that the rider came with peaceful intentions as a king of peace, not of war. The crowd that greeted Jesus threw their cloaks on the ground in front of him as a sign of submission and homage. He was greeted as a Messiah, not one who would save them but one who would lead them against the Romans. Their chants of Hosanna meant "save now." They waved palms in the air and also laid them on the path before him, as was the practice with political leaders to show triumph and victory.

Pre-Christians used palms as a symbol of victory and goodness. Later in time, the Early Christians used palms to show victory of the spirit over the flesh and explains why many Martyrs (including St. Agnes) are shown holding palms. The palms we receive on Sunday are a sacramental because they are blessed and therefore should be treated with respect. They are to be kept as a witness to our faith in Jesus Christ and in his Paschal Victory. Blessed palms should never to be thrown in the trash but returned to the church to be burned into ashes for distribution on Ash Wednesday.

After all have processed into the church carrying their palms, the Order of the Mass continues. When the Gospel is proclaimed, we shift from the joyous entrance into Jerusalem, to the reading of the Passion; a stark reminder of what the week has in store for us as we reflect on Jesus' journey to the cross. This weeklong time of preparation, reminds us of the sacrifice Jesus made for us in accepting his father's will. We look forward with great anticipation to Easter Sunday!
