We have an exciting event happening this Saturday, the Diocese of Oakland is holding its first Academic Junior High Decathlon at Moreau High School and WE are sending our very own first team to the competition! The past couple of years, a couple of schools in our Diocese were able to join with another Diocese to participate. This year our Associate Superintendent, Karen Goodshaw (St. Agnes alumnae) offered this opportunity to our schools and nine of us registered! According to the Catholic Academic Junior Decathlon website, our team of junior high students will be competing in 10 events:

- "Two are collaborative team efforts a Logic Quiz with 20 rigorous thinking problems, and a Super Quiz with 50 multiple choice questions on five broad academic themes.
- The remaining eight events test individual knowledge of the Roman Catholic doctrine, English, Literature, Science, Mathematics, Current Events, Social Studies, and Fine Arts (Art and Music)."

This concept began 1989 when Dr. Mark Ryan (junior high teacher) wanted to offer students an academic competition that was similar to athletic competitions in the Los Angeles area. This event was embraced over the years and has now become a National event. We are excited to join with the other 25 Dioceses across the Nation in celebrating our students for their academic achievement.
